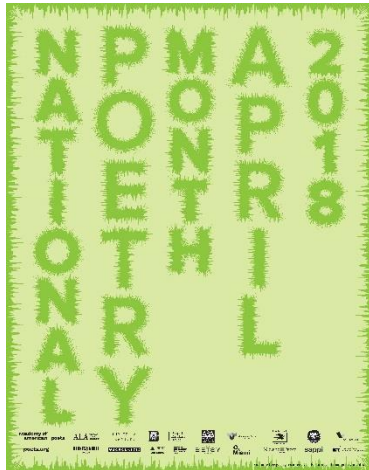




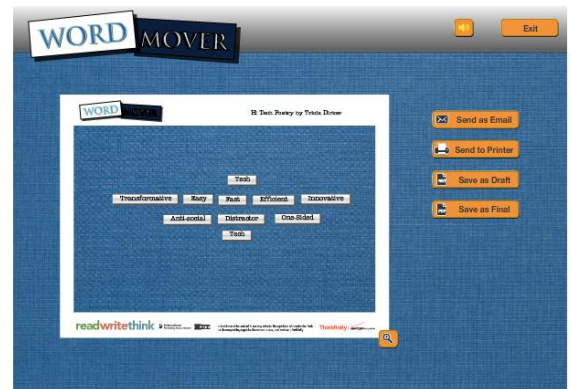
Oh! The Places You'll Go ... When Students Use Tech to Create Beautiful Poetry!
